**A. CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Matt Christenson called the May 15, 2023 meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

**B. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE & INVOCATION**

The Pledge of Allegiance was said. The invocation was given by Pastor Chu Chang.

**C. ROLL CALL & APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA**

Council Present: Mark Trummel, Haley Kern, Nathan Charlton, and Chance Little were present. Pam Reves was absent. City Administrator Stacy Barnes and Fire Chief Theron McKinney were also present. Julie Lyon and Grant Neuhold were in the audience.

Charlton made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Kern seconded, and the motion was passed 4-0.

**D. CITIZEN COMMENTS**

There were no comments before or during the meeting.

**E. CONSENT AGENDA**

Kern motioned to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Charlton seconded the motion, which passed 4-0.

**F. APPOINTMENTS: Greensburg Tree Board**

There are 3 terms on the Tree Board that will expire May 31, 2023. These are 3-year terms. Jeanie Finch and Randy Rinker have expressed interest in serving. The board is to consist of 6-9 members. Kern made a motion, seconded by Trummel, to appoint Finch and Rinker to the board. The motion passed unanimously.

**G. ITEMS OF BUSINESS**

**1. Fire Department Pump Purchase**

Chief McKinney was present to discuss the purchase of a new pump for Rescue 1. Three potential options were presented in the meeting packet. McKinney's first choice was the PowerFlow HPX200-B18 Attack Pump for \$5,220, through Emergency Fire Equipment. Kern, seconded by Trummel, motioned to approve McKinney to spend up to \$6,500 for a new pump out of Fire Equipment Reserve. The motion passed 4-0.

**2. PowerUp Greensburg 4<sup>th</sup> of July Fireworks Funding Request**

Grant Neuhold, representing PowerUp Greensburg, requested Council once again contribute \$1,500 toward fireworks for the community July 4<sup>th</sup> celebration and that City Staff assist with the disposal of spent fireworks after the event. The motion to approve the request was made by Little and seconded by Charlton. The motion passed 4-0.

**3. Kiowa County Economic Development Childcare Funding Match Request**

Julie Lyon, Kiowa County Economic Development Director, updated Council on the grant submission for a tri-plex development, primarily to house additional daycare space. Lyon asked for \$10,000 as a contingent grant from the City. Little moved to approve a \$20,000 contingent grant from the Economic

Development Fund. Kern seconded, and the motion passed 4-0. Lyon reviewed new Economic Development program incentives that are available for housing, renovations, painting, commercial façades, and dilapidated structures.

#### H. CITY STAFF REPORTS

Barnes reported to Council on the following topics:

- **SPRINT Grant:** Last week, the Kansas Department of Commerce announced awards for the SPRINT grant program. Unfortunately, the City’s application for an addition to the Big Well Museum was not awarded. There were 18 awards made of \$30 million out of more than 220 applications totaling over \$670 million in funding requests.
- **2024 Budget:** Barnes will be starting the 2024 budget process soon. This Thursday she will be on the State’s budget workshop webinar for a good portion of the day to get the updates for this year. The draft budget will begin with items previously discussed. If there are other items the Council would like to discuss for inclusion they were asked to communicate those to Barnes.
- **Planning Commission:** There is a Planning Commission meeting Wednesday at 6:30 for a public hearing on a conditional use permit for multi-family housing for the County’s upcoming MIH grant application. Upon approval of the Planning Commission, this will come before the Council for final approval.
- **Park Improvements:** Barnes has made contact with Mid-America Courtworks and Greensburg is on their schedule to have the Davis Park courts resurfaced. This will not occur until September/early October. The pumptrack should be here in July for installation at Wise Park.
- **Swimming Pool:** The swimming pool will open Monday, May 29<sup>th</sup>. Lifeguards will be training this Friday the 19<sup>th</sup> through Sunday the 21<sup>st</sup>, both at the pool and at City Hall in the Council Chambers.
- **Employee Activities:** Employees have been pulling weeds on Main Street, mowing, crack sealing, making utility service connections, performing the monthly meter readings.
- **Election:** The filing deadline for Mayor and 2 City Council positions election is one month away, at Noon on June 1<sup>st</sup>.
- **Weekend Events:** This weekend, May 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>, is the Annual Triangle Rodeo Club Rodeo, including a parade Saturday morning. Saturday, May 27<sup>th</sup>, will be the Memorial Weekend events including Arts and Crafts Fair, Parade, and Street Dance.

Trummel asked questions regarding the new drainage pipe at the airport.

#### I. GOVERNING BODY COMMENTS

There were no additional comments from the Governing Body.

#### J. ADJOURNMENT

With nothing further to discuss, Christenson declared the meeting adjourned at 6:23 p.m.

**Agenda Item F.1      2022 Audit Presentation: Jim Kennedy, Kennedy & McKee**

Jim will be at the meeting to present the 2022 audit report. Hard copies will be available at the meeting.

**Agenda Item F.2      Haviland Broadband: Grant Support Proposal**

Diane Thompson from Haviland Broadband will be at the meeting to present a support request for a LINC (Lasting Infrastructure and Network Connectivity) grant from the Kansas Department of Commerce. This grant is to improve broadband infrastructure in Kansas. HBB has asked the City to support their grant application to expand fiber infrastructure to the north side of Greensburg (see attached map.) They are also requesting as a match to the grant application, the City waive the right of way payments for the new infrastructure, approximately 4 miles of line, for a five-year period. This would only apply to this new expansion, not to current fiber lines in place. Our current agreement with HBB is for \$500 per year per mile of fiber line in the City. If approved, this would be approximately \$2,000 per year, and \$10,000 over the five-year period.

This letter has been reviewed by Clayton and he didn't see any issues with the proposed agreement.

**Agenda Item F.3      Conditional Use Permit: 2023-01 CU, 217 E. Grant**

Included in your packet are documents for the 2023-01 Conditional Use application by Monica and Dale Hayse to potentially build a 5-plex at 217 E. Grant Avenue. The Hayse's have partnered with Kiowa County on a submission to the KHRC MIH Grant program.


Included is the staff report memo regarding this case, CUP application, site plan and unapproved minutes from the May 17, 2023 Planning Commission meeting. This application was approved unanimously by the Greensburg Planning Commission.

The required two-week waiting period has passed and now is presented to City Council for final approval.

The City of Greensburg has benefitted greatly from its longstanding relationship with Haviland Broadband. After our town suffered such devastation by tornado in 2007, Haviland Broadband was the first to commit to bringing adequate Internet services back to the community with a fixed wireless system. More recently they have brought fiber optic Internet to a majority of our city situated south of US Highway 54. The area north of the highway is less densely populated and is challenged by a KDOT right-of-way for future highway expansion. It has limited fiber service and is primarily served by fixed wireless.

In accordance with the City's licensing standards, Haviland Broadband pays an annual fee equal to \$500 per mile of buried facilities in the City's Right-of-way.

Please accept this letter as the City of Greensburg's statement of support for Haviland Broadband's LINC grant application that includes fiber expansion into the remaining areas of our city. As a sign of our desire and commitment to the project, the City also commits an in-kind match equal to five years waiver of Right-of-way fees on new fiber optic facilities placed in the funded area within the Greensburg City limits, estimated to be 4 miles of line at \$2,000 per year, or \$10,000 total over the five year period.

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**Background:** Earlier this year, the Kiowa County Commissioners selected a project proposal from Dale and Monica Hayse for their application to the Kansas Housing Resource Corporation (KHRC) Kansas Moderate Income Housing (MIH) Grant Program. A large portion of the application being submitted to KHRC is for construction of a 5-plex at 217 E. Grant Ave., property owned by the Hayses.

**Analysis:** The property to be developed is zoned R-1A Single Family Residential. The adopted Sustainable Land Development Code states that multi-family dwellings larger than a duplex are not allowed in this zone, even with a Conditional Use. That being said, there were larger multi-family dwellings in this zoning district prior to the 2007 disaster, which were allowed to be re-established (Elmore Heights and Komotara Apts.). The Hayses do own the two 5-plexes across the street from this property; however, they are in the RV-P Planned Residential Village zoning district. Multi-family dwellings such as those across the street, Prairie View and Oak View Apartments along Main Street, as well as the Oak Haven apartments to the north on Nebraska are permitted without a conditional use in the RV-P. The zoning district boundary line is Grant Ave.

Included in the packet is a proposed site plan that complies with R-1A setback requirements. Minimum Setbacks Required: 25' front yard; 6' side yard; 20' rear yard; sight triangle as required in Section 2.5 "Corner Sight Visibility". Images of the proposed project from the Hayses and a zoning map with the proposed property marked with a green circle are included. I also marked the locations of the other multi-family complexes located in town with purple circles.

The proposed development seems to nearly mirror the 5-plexes across the street. The footprint would fill the remaining vacant lots on the south 200 block of E. Grant, without creating disruption to the developed area and surrounding single-family homes. The single-family home to the west is a rental unit, as are the single-family homes to the east.

It is the wish of the Hayses and the Kiowa County Commissioners to contribute to efforts to provide needed housing within Kiowa County.

**Recommendations/Actions:** Approve the Conditional Use application to construct a 5-plex on property commonly known as 217 E. Grant Ave.

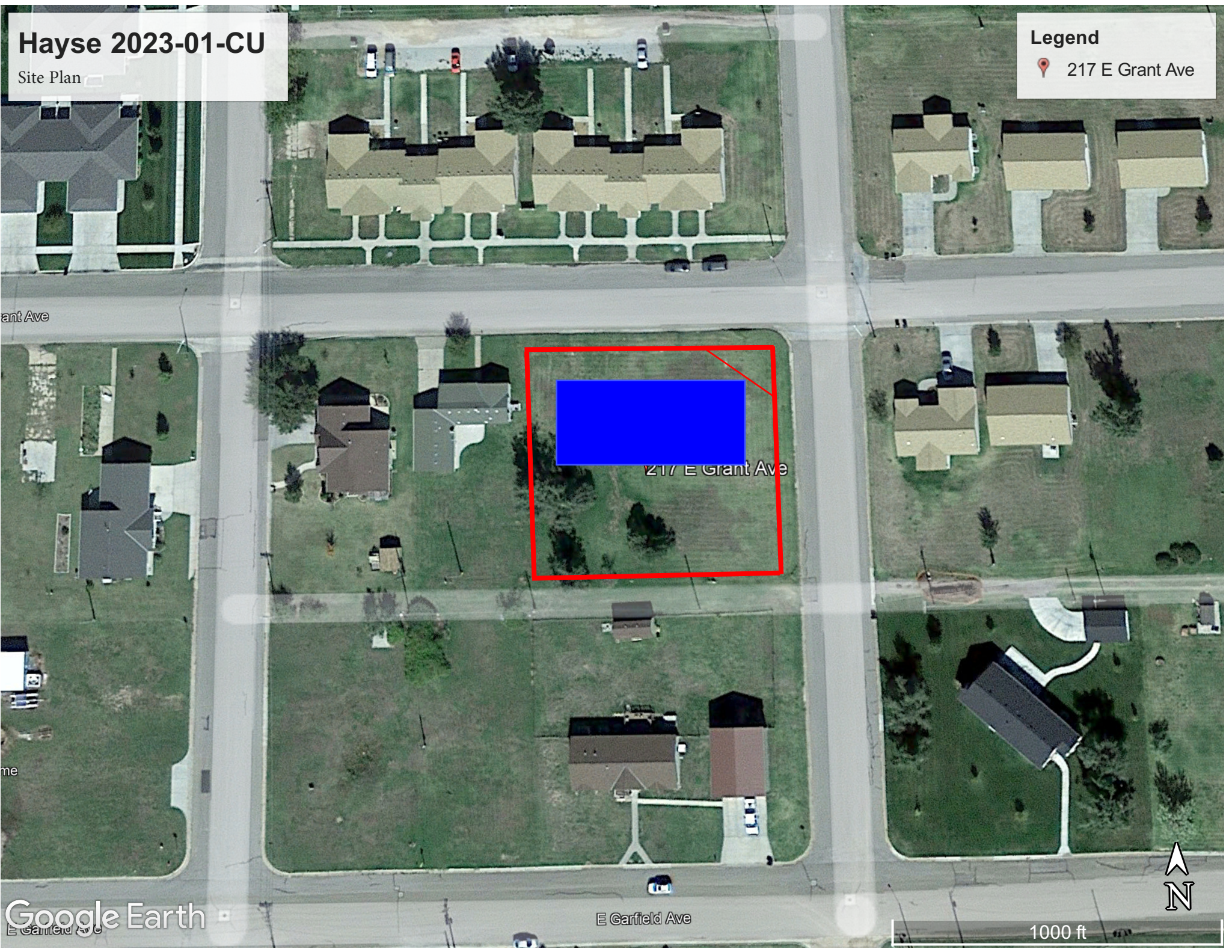

Site Plan

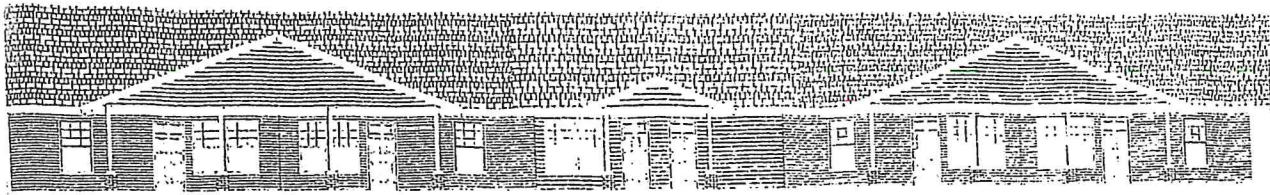
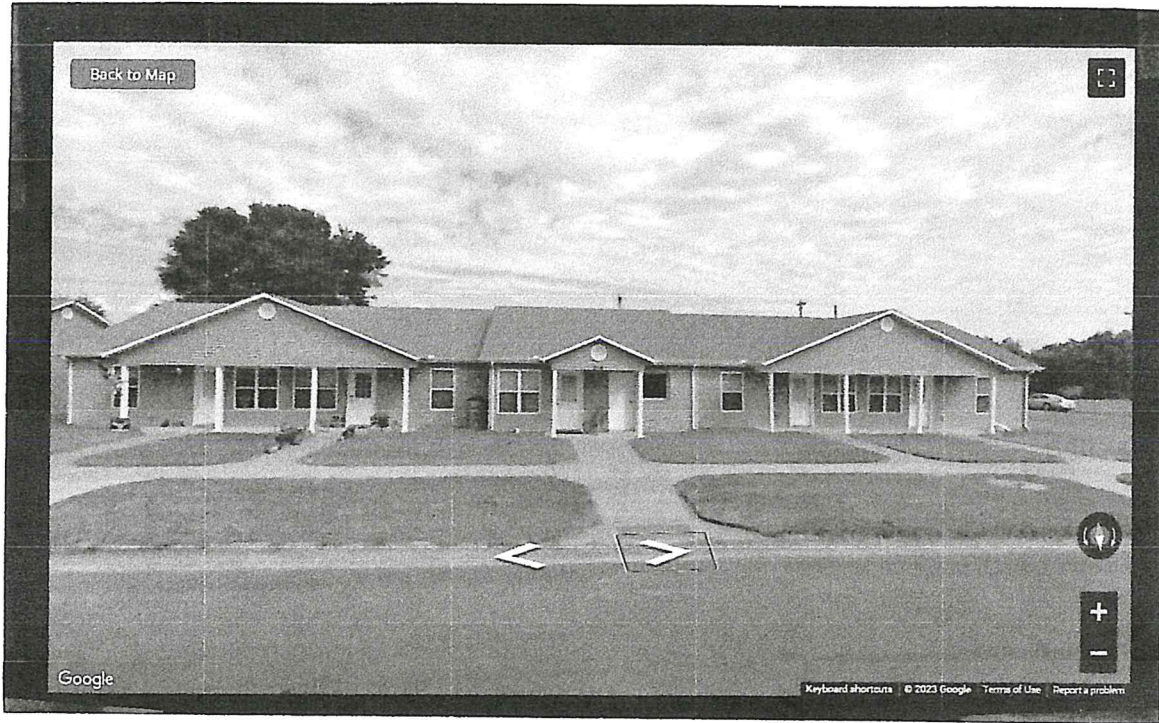

**A) Call to Order**

Pam Reves called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm.

**B) Roll Call**

Roll call was taken with the following members present: Pamela Reves, Georgina Rodriguez, and Shawn Cannon. Loren Campbell and Scott Eller were absent. City Clerk Christy Pyatt was also present, along with applicant Monica Hayse.

**C) Approval of Minutes**

Cannon made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 29, 2023 meeting. Rodriguez seconded, and the motion passed 3-0.

**D) Conditional Use Permit 2023-01-CU**

Pyatt gave a brief staff report on the Conditional Use application before the Commission. Earlier this year, the Kiowa County Commissioners selected a project proposal from Dale and Monica Hayse for their application to the Kansas Housing Resource Corporation (KHRC) Kansas Moderate Income Housing (MIH) Grant Program. A large portion of the application being submitted is for construction of a 5-plex at 217 E. Grant Ave., property owned by the Hayses. The property lies just across the RV-P Planned Residential Village zoning district line in the R-1A Residential district. R-1A as of right does not allow for multi-family dwellings larger than a duplex; in fact, they are not even recommended as a Conditional Use. Pyatt noted that there have been multi-family dwellings in this zone for years. With that and the fact that the Hayse's having a mirror image 5-plex directly across the street to the north and there are other multi-family properties in the surrounding area, Staff feels that the request should be considered. Information provided in the meeting packet included a draft site plan and elevations of the proposed development. The proposed development would fill vacant without creating disruption to the developed area and surrounding single-family homes. The single-family home to the west is a rental unit, as are the single-family homes to the east.

Monica Hayse provided additional information regarding the project. Development of the 5-plex is, at this time, contingent on the County being awarded a the MIH grant. The other portion of the MIH application, building a single-family home on an existing basement at Oak and Iowa, will move forward regardless. The 5-plex would house 2-bedroom apartments. Unlike the 5-plex across the street, there would not be a storm shelter built within the complex. Residents would cross the street to the adjacent 5-plex for safety in the event of a tornado.

Rodriguez motioned to recommend approval of the application, as long as Council is ok with the "other properties". Cannon seconded her motion to approve the request. The motion passed unanimously.

**E) Staff Items**

Pyatt mentioned a potential Conditional Use request, related to multi-family housing and childcare, to come before the Commission in the coming weeks.

**F) Adjournment**

Reves declared the meeting adjourned at 6:46 p.m.

Subject: May 2023 Monthly Report

Attached to this report is our activity report breaking down the different types of calls and traffic violations for the month of May.

During May, the department had 216 calls for service, including 169 traffic stops which resulted in 126 traffic citations being issued. Of the remaining 47 calls for service, 18 resulted in investigative and criminal cases being opened. Of these calls for service, 29 of them were dispatched by Kiowa County Emergency Communications and 3 were initiated by a citizen either finding an officer or calling the Police Department. This month 13 adults were arrested and booked into the Kiowa County Detention Center for misdemeanor and felony criminal charges. Additionally, one adult was cited and released through Greensburg Municipal Court for cruelty to an animal.

I have hired Jace Gwinn as a Part-Time Police Officer and he will begin working with us this month. Officer Gwinn lives in Pratt and works for the Pratt Police Department full-time. Officer Gwinn comes to us highly recommended and motivated.

I have also hired Nicholas Allen as a Full-Time Police Officer and he will begin employment with us in the first part of July. Officer Allen comes to us with full-time law enforcement experience from the Pratt Police Department and his wife is also in law enforcement. Officer Allen has family ties to Haviland and will be moving back with his family. Officer Allen is excited to begin working with us and has a strong focus on community policing and criminal interdiction.
